The Juvenile Crime Prevention Council (JCPC) has studied the risk factors and needs of Juvenile Court involved youth in this county and hereby publishes this Request for Proposals. The JCPC anticipates funds from the NC Dept. of Public Safety, Division of Juvenile Justice in the amount stated above to fund the program types specified below. Such programs will serve delinquent and at-risk youth for the state **fiscal year 2012-2013** beginning on, or after, **July 1, 2012**. The use of these funds in this county **requires a local match** in the amount specified above.

The JCPC will consider proposals for the following needed programs:

Proposed program services should target the following risk factors for delinquency or repeat delinquency:

Of 30 youth coming to the attention of Caswell County Juvenile Services, 65% are having regular associations with delinquent peers. Indicators suggest that parents are unable to supervise youth. Youth are in need of more mental health assessment and treatment services. Thirty-six percent (36%) of youth are abusing substances. Risk indicators suggest that youth are experiencing problems in the school setting including truancy and/or frequent suspensions from schools.

Programs should address the following concerns as reported in the Needs Assessments for adjudicated youth:

Peer Domain:	Fifteen percent (15%) of youth are associated with gangs. Indicators suggest that the majority of youth coming to the attention of Caswell Juvenile Services are in need of prosocial interpersonal skills.
Individual Domain:	Youth are participating in dangerous sexualized behaviors or have victimized others. Indicators suggest that youth are abusing substances and are in need of assessment or treatment services.
Family Domain:	12% of youth are victims of abuse and 21% of youth are experiencing domestic discord or violence in the home. Indicators suggest that there is alcohol or drug use in the family an 30% of youth have families where members have criminal histories or actively involved with the court or gangs.
School Domain:	Indicators suggest that youth are having difficulty in the school setting as evidenced by truant behaviors or multiple suspensions from school.

Applicants are being sought that are able to address items below:

1. Program services compatible with research that are shown to be effective with juvenile offenders.
2. Program services are outcome-based.
3. The program has an evaluation component.
4. Program services detect gang participation and divert individuals from gang participation.

Local public agencies, 501(c)(3) non-profit corporations and local housing authorities are invited to submit applications to provide services addressing the above elements.
